SLI fights for religious freedom on a regular basis. Much of our attention is centered on protecting religious rights in the public square. For example, we have fielded several questions and wrote letters in September concerning the "Meet You at the Pole" annual prayer event at public schools. At the same time, we occasionally must take a stand on the improper practice of religion in the public square.

This month's Educational Update is a letter to public school officials about a longtime state policy against teaching yoga and other eastern mystic religions in public schools. There was a request by a Hindu leader to remove the prohibition of such teaching. Our response was directed to the Governor, Superintendent and State Board of Education.

No doubt you followed the Judge Brett Kavanaugh hearings. Senator Orrin Hatch opined that they were worse than what Justice Clarence Thomas and Judge Robert Bork confronted.
